

In October 2022, Dayton Habitat partnered with other community organizations and local residents to hold its first Rock the Block event to perform clean up projects in the Edgemont neighborhood of Dayton. All of this work was done to improve the area and help the residents of Edgemont develop a greater sense of pride in their neighborhood.





During 2023, Dayton Habitat replaced 37 roofs for area seniors ensuring that their homes were warm and dry.




Our Golden Hammer retiree volunteer group contributed 3,955 service hours in 2023.





Olive, Oliver & Olis

Olive was born in Rwanda and because of the turmoil caused by the wars, she found herself living in a refugee camp. Having a university degree hadn't helped her find work and she was struggling to feed her family. With her growing son, Olive knew that she needed to find a better life, one with a brighter future for her family. She decided that moving to the United States offered she and her son, Oliver, the best opportunities and so she took the risk. Leaving her family behind, she temporarily moved to Kenya where she could apply for a lottery that would allow her to legally enter the United States. She won and soon had visas for her and Oliver.

In 2015, Olive and Oliver arrived in Dayton. Since then, money has been tight and their apartment complex has been full of crime, including shootings. Olive's second son, Olis, is now three and she wants a home that is safer for her family. Because of Habitat for Humanity of Greater Dayton, she has that now!

Kasandra & Aa'sjayla

Kasandra is no stranger to the benefits of owning a Habitat for Humanity of Greater Dayton home. She grew up in one that her mom owned. She got to see how successful her mom was during that time, and she formed her own dreams of homeownership early on. When she became a parent, Kasandra wanted her daughter, Aa'sjayla to have the same benefits that she had growing up.

Although Kasandra's mom set an example for her, owning her own home was hard for her to imagine. The realities of being a single mom to a 12-year-old were hard to overcome. For instance, Kasandra needed to go back and earn her high school diploma. Aa'sjayla had been diagnosed with ADHD and other social development issues when she was 4, which added to Kassandra's challenges. Kasandra knew that if she was ever going to own her own home, she needed to call Habitat for Humanity. The single mom contacted Habitat in September of 2021 and was soon accepted!

Home Repairs



63 Critical Repairs Completed in 2023

In 2023, Habitat for Humanity of Greater Dayton completed 63 critical home repairs.

Targeting primarily seniors and veterans, these repairs allow families of limited income to remain in their homes and age in place. The repairs made to their homes are done at no cost to the homeowner and are repairs that they could not afford to make on their own.

Repairs like furnace and hot water heater replacements, roof repairs, wheel chair ramps, or even just widening a doorway into a bathroom for wheelchair access can make a massive difference in someone's life.

Katara & her family

Katara was born and raised in Springfield, OH. It's a city that she knows and loves. However, that doesn't mean that life in Springfield has been easy for her. During her life, Katara has lived in 15 rental properties and doesn't want the same for her children. Not only will Katara be a first-generation home buyer, she is also a first generation high school and college graduate within her family.

When asked about her vision of her family in their new Dayton Habitat home, Katara spoke at length about safety for her children. Shootings are such a frequent occurrence in her area, that her children are not allowed to play in the front of her house. The result is that her children have never learned to ride a bike.


Katara is not afraid of hard work. Because of her work and the generosity of Dayton Habitat supporters, her family lives in a safe, secure home!

Tiffany, Diondra & Dion

For Tiffany, a mother of four children, renting is all that her family has ever known. That doesn't mean that Tiffany hasn't been dreaming of owning her own home. Especially when she thinks about her family's safety.

There have been a few safety scares over the years. Once a bullet entered their home and prior to that incident, a neighbor was shot and killed. Thinking about what could happen to her children is always a concern for Tiffany.

Now, Tiffany is raising her youngest two children, Diondra and Dion. Tiffany learned about Habitat for Humanity of Greater Dayton's Homeownership Program eight years ago. Even though her finances needed some work before she could be accepted into the program, Tiffany wasn't discouraged. She is currently a medical assistant at a hospital in Kettering and used her great job to turn her finances around. When she was ready, Tiffany reapplied for the program and was accepted. Tiffany has been working hard attending her homeownership classes and putting in her sweat equity hours ever since.



Gail

Gail's story starts at Dayton's Hill Top homes in the late 60s where she lived until her father died in 1972, causing her family to move to another home. Then in the 5th grade Gail, and her family moved again. In the 8th grade...you guessed it, they moved once more. During Gail's 9th grade year, the building that she and her family were living in was set on fire because one of the tenants was murdered, forcing another abrupt relocation.

Each move meant more than a new location for the family. Gail was also forced to change schools and make new friends. There were other disruptions as well. Her mom became paralyzed on her right side, which led to her passing away in 1982. New responsibilities began to fall on Gail's shoulders. As Gail began her own family, the frequent moves only continued.

Her new home represents a new sense of security and permanence that she was ready for!




